## Installation Process

### Preparing Your Property

1st Avenue Construction Inc. will contact you to find out your availability for the delivery and installation of your roofing system. During the material delivery, it is important to have your driveway cleared of vehicles to provide access to your home. In most cases, roofing materials will be placed directly onto the roof and will not block access to your garage. Moving cars out of garages and to the street ensures them to be safe during re-roofing project along with any patio furniture, and potted plants. Prior to installation, we encourage you identify anything in your home that could shift during the installation. Please remember that the construction process is noisy and vibrations will be felt throughout your home. You will want to secure delicate items prior to beginning of work.

### Installation of Your New Roof

The 1st Avenue Construction Inc. installation crew will notify you of their arrival. They will move items around the exterior of your home and/or protect them from falling debris. Please remember to keep children and pets inside or away from the construction zone, which will be clearly marked. The crew foreman will coordinate the entire project. Additionally, our Roofing Installation Supervisor will provide oversight while assuring adherence to all regulations and local building code requirements. Prior to leaving the property, our crew will complete an inspection checklist and remove any debris related to the installation process. If the paint is affected during construction, we offer painted drip edge, however it may not match correctly due to the colors available in the market. .

### Post Installation

An 1st Avenue Construction Inc. Quality Control Coordinator will inspect your completed installation and pick up any excess material. During construction, debris such as shingles, shakes, nails, etc. can scatter the property. We will clean the property thoroughly and we will probe your property with magnets to pick up any loose nails. Please be aware that nails may be hidden in grass, snow, or shrubs. Once the project has been ratified, our Inspection Coordinator will be notified to contact the local Building Department and schedule your permit's final inspection. Many jurisdictions require the contractor to post a ladder providing their Inspector access to your roof. In these cases, we secure our ladder to your gutter in accordance with OSHA regulations. We will return for the ladder when the Building Department completes their inspection.
